#### November 19 - Stetson Mansion Christmas Spectacular

Stetson, of Stetson hat fame, this estate was Florida's first luxury home. The home is recognized as one of USA Today's "10 Best Holiday Home Tours in the US" (It ranks #5 nationwide) and is Tripadvisor's #1 landmark attraction in Florida. Explore lavish interiors filled with original mosaic parquet flooring, thousands of antique glass panes, and an array of unique handcrafted details—plus the distinction of being Florida's first snowbird home, the first home with electricity, (Mr.Stetson was best friends with Thomas Edison) steam heat, indoor plumbing, and a call-bell system (like on Downton Abbey).

### **Annual Holiday Luncheon**

On Thursday, December 4th at 11:30 BFT/R will be getting together at Tuscany Grill in the Avenues of Viera for our yearly Holiday Luncheon.

The menu will feature the same selections as last year, cost \$22 per person, to be paid at the restaurant. BFT/R will cover the tax and tip.

This annual gathering is a special way to end the year, sharing laughter and friendship with fellow retirees. The choices are:

<u>Salmon Acropolis</u> – "60 South" Salmon sautéed with artichokes, red peppers and sun-dried tomatoes, in lemonwhite wine butter, served over fettuccine.

<u>Eggplant Rollatini</u> - Thin sliced battered eggplant stuffed with a garlic ricotta blend, baked and topped with mozzarella and served over spaghetti and marinara.

<u>Lasagna</u> - Pasta sheets layered with ground sirloin, ricotta and mozzarella cheeses and Italian herbs, baked in our homemade ragout and covered with melted mozzarella.

<u>Chicken Marsala</u> - Tender chicken breast served with sauteed mushrooms in a Marsala and light cream sauce, served over angel hair.

<u>Mediterranean Salad</u> - Mixed greens, hearts of palm, red onion, olives, artichoke hearts, tomatoes, and feta cheese with Greek dressing (with or without grilled chicken).

The lunch includes bread, house salad, soda or tea and a cannoli for dessert.

The cost is \$22/person., pay at the restaurant. BFT/R is paying the tax and gratuity.

We walk each class around tables of grade level books. The room is silent until after we give a short talk of rules. Then the room breaks out into happy voices as children search for their interest book bag. After their selection of a book bag, the children are directed over to another table with extra items of bookmarks, tissue holder, or tiny stuffed animals.

I overheard some children's remarks:

"This is so much fun and now we have to go back."

"I hope they come back."

"I am glad you are retired."

One 1st grade boy said. "I am sick and do not want to spread my germs so can you please pick up a book for me?" When he stood in front of his choice, I picked it up and gave it to him.

At another school a teacher assistant that I know personally told me this:

I can see that you all really put a great effort in preparing the packages--like matching the plush toys with book themes and also preparing the beautiful handmade bags.
