We are getting closer to the start of the 2026 Florida Legislative Session and that means we all normally hold our breath and pray we get through it all without major disruptions to life and property.


Well here are already three main issues you will most likely hear about:

- 1. Ron DeSantis and the legislature paid \$83.3 million of our tax dollars for 4 acres of land in Destin, Florida from a prominent Republican donor in what many are calling a major land deal scam. This was added to the budget in the last minutes before it was finalized.
- 2. There are bills to protect Mosaic Phosphate Company from liability in lawsuits where homes have been built on reclaimed land. Mosaic has been working on building roads with toxic waste and injecting toxic waste into the deep aquifer. Mosaic is also a major contributor to members of the Florida Legislature.
- 3. Bills that are killed and keep coming back are referred to as Zombie Bills. Here is one: The issues involving fetal personhood are coming up again with a bill Civil Liability for the Wrongful Death of an Unborn Child.

Buckle up and hunker down. This Legislative Session officially starts in January, but the members have been working in committee since September.
